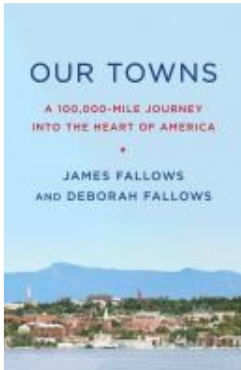

The federal income tax filing due date for individuals for the 2020 tax year will be automatically extended from April 15, 2021 to May 17, 2021.

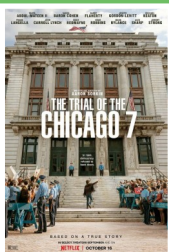
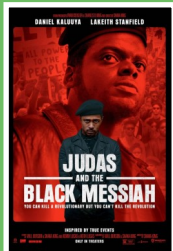
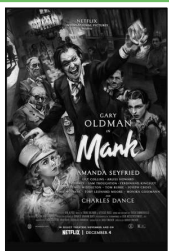
Individual taxpayers do not need to file any forms or call the IRS to qualify for this federal tax filing and payment relief extension.

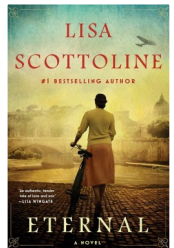

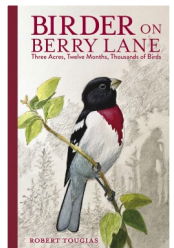
ETERNAL BY LISA SCOTTOLINE

Scottoline offers a sweeping and shattering epic of historical fiction fueled by shocking true events, the tale of a love triangle that unfolds in the heart of Rome, in the creeping shadow of fascism. Elisabetta, Marco, and Sandro grow up as best friends despite their differences. But in the autumn of 1937, everything changes as Mussolini asserts his power, aligning Italy's Fascists with Hitler's Nazis.



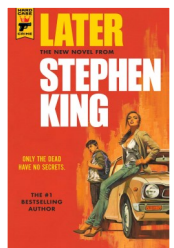
BIRDER ON BERRY LANE BY ROBERT TOUGIAS

Tougias's house on Berry Lane may look like a typical suburban home, but as his fascinating account reveals, its backyard is teeming with nature's mysteries. Sensitive to the activities of birds, he notes which species are present, which are breeding, and where their nests are. Acutely observed writing reveals the miracles of the ordinary in the subtle changes of the ecosystem of the woods, streams, and meadow that make up the sprawling backyard on Berry Lane.



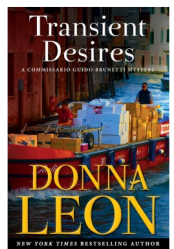
LATER BY STEPHEN KING

As Brunetti and his colleague investigate the incident, they discover that one of the men works for a sinister man. Brunetti must trust unfamiliar colleagues to solve a peculiarly horrible crime.

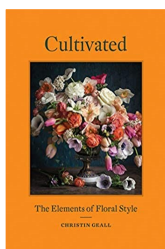
HOW BEAUTIFUL WE WERE BY IMBOLO MBUE

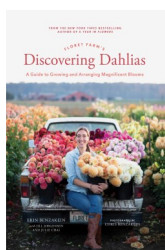
CULTIVATED: THE ELEMENTS OF FLORAL STYLE BY CHRISTIN GEALL

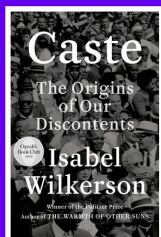

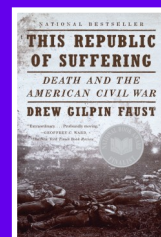
